

Now at Future Biomanufacturing Research Hub, Matthew is developing novel routes to biological carbon capture utilisation and store using photosynthetic and chemoautotrophic bacteria.

Helen's research focuses on waste and disposal and is involved in two projects: One Bin to Rule Them All and The Waste Tip. One Bin to Rule Them All is a UKRI funded project with social sciences, material science and business models to explore how we can improve plastic recycling. The Waste Tip is a UMRI funded project on fly-tipping to understand the impact, why it happens and how it can be tackled. The project involves, social science, material science, business and management, and engineering.
